Introduction

This series deals with a grid – a basic tool cryptographers use to separate sequences of data into columns and rows. It is very common and appears in substitution ciphers (like Vigenère or Playfair) or in transposition ciphers (like columnar transposition, route cipher, or grille cipher) or in ciphers that use both substitution and transposition (like ADFGVX).


The purpose of the grid is to give a plaintext, ciphertext, or a key some structure so that the encryption/decryption process can be done more systematically.




Challenge (1/2)

The process of solving this challenge is similar to attacking the route cipher where the attacker has to identify the secret pattern inside the grid that has been used for encryption.

Start by looking at the first image — which should be self-explanatory and should give you enough hints to find the right route in order to reveal the plaintext of the second image.
